Why update Colorado's Voting System?



More Fairness

Current: Either no majority is required
- or- there is a low-turnout runoff.
Reform: Majority required in one election.



More Choice

Current: Voters are pressured to vote strategically. Reform: Voters can securely vote true preferences -and- more variety of candidates can run.




More Voice

Current: Mud-slinging is rewarded. Reform: Winning campaigns focus on issues -and- voters are more engaged.

PLURALITY Elections

The winner would not have had a majority...due to vote splitting. Todd Brown would have been a "spoiler."



RANKED CHOICE Elections


2015 Telluride Mayoral Race

The winner has a majority...from an instant runoff.

There is a community consensus.




RCV Tally - Round 1

RCV Tally - Round 2




Inactive Ballots (no candidate choices left) 9 votes


Voters say the tone was more positive


Voters like RCV
